


C1 Study area location.




C2 Study area site distribution and administrative district.





The gazetteer lists plasterwork dating between 1550 and 1640 found in a domestic context in the study area, which comprises: Cornwall, Devon and Somerset and West Dorset. The gazetteer entries are ordered by counties, followed by administrative districts and parishes. Missing or unknown data is represented by '?'.

- 1. <u>UID</u> the unique identification number comprising a two letter district code followed by a number. The numbers relate to the distribution maps in Appendix C. The UID appears in bold text where the house/plasterwork was visited and recorded for this study.
- 2. <u>Address</u> name or number the house is currently known by and the street/ road name. Alternative or former names are given in brackets. Where the building is believed to be no longer extant this is followed by NLE.
- 3. Civil Parish the modern parish where the house is located.
- 4. NGR the Ordnance Survey national grid reference to six figures.
- 5. <u>Building type</u> where available these have been taken from the National Heritage List description.
- 6. <u>Status</u> an assessment of the class of house when the plasterwork was installed, based on the criteria set out by Brunskill:<sup>1</sup>
